Are you coming from Bordeaux? You're 1 hr by TGV or 2 hr 30 by car from Greater Poitiers.



Tornado Chasers, new attraction crowned "best attraction in the world"

"Tornado Chasers", a new immersive attraction inaugurated in **summer 2022**, takes visitors into the laboratory of meteorologists Alex and Mélanie, from the queue to the core of the vortex. The idea? Immerse visitors in the heart of this weather phenomenon to witness an apocalyptic scene.

Magical scenography and special effects, which **allowed it to be crowned "best attraction in the world"** by a jury of professionals, brought together within the Themed Entertainment Association (TEA) in the United States, which has chosen to reward **both the artistic and technical excellence and the innovation** of Tornado Chasers.

Even more recently, in November 2022, the attraction received the coveted **"Thea Award for OutstandingAchievement"** from the IAAPA (International Association of Amusement Parks and Attractions, **on the sidelines of the IAAPA Expo trade show in Orlando** (Florida).

The choice was made from among 300 competing candidates, including theme park giants from all over the world.

The François Frères umbrella factory

Pierre and Louis, two brothers descended from 5 generations of craftsmen, have made us all love bad weather. In their workshop created in 1882, one of the last artisanal umbrella factories in France, **they make umbrellas that couldn't be more durable**:15 to 20 years' life expectancy for a carbon fibre umbrella. People almost pray for rain to get a piece of this real Poitiers family institution, whose know-how is still handed down between generations, with the arrival of Lylian, Pierre's son-in-law.

Monébari leather goods

In his workshop-boutique, **Chauvigny's Xavier Piganeau makes satchels, briefcases and other fancy shoulder bags**. The 30-year-old, who became a leather goods maker in 2019, was trained by Lydie Gallet, who notably worked for Hermès. You'll also find this square "French" style in his elegant, colourful creations.

UNUSUAL GREATER POITIERS

Lifelong locals or day-trippers, the stories that follow will arouse everyone's curiosity! **The destination is full of anecdotes and places, each as surprising as the next**. Here are a few...

Manneken Pis, for a touch of Brussels

Poitiers can boast **of hosting one of the six official copies of the Manneken Pis**! Indeed, in May 1940, when Belgium was occupied by the Germans, the Belgian government had to go into exile. It found refuge in Poitiers, which then became the capital of Belgium for 26 days, from 23 May to 17 June 1940. As a sign of recognition, Belgian police officials offered a perfect copy of the Manneken Pis to their Poitevin counterparts. It stands today in the hallway of the city's police station.

A Statue of Liberty, for a New York feel

Located on Place de la Liberté in Poitiers, this statue actually has no connection with the United States. In fact, this is where the pillory was located, where criminals and other bandits were executed under the Regime of Terror. It was on this square that General Berton was executed in 1822. Accused of conspiracy, his last words were "Long live freedom!"». In 1903, this replica of Bartholdi's Statue of Liberty, funded by the Freemasons, was erected in homage to him.

The Fanzinothèque, the largest alternative collection in Europe

Have you ever heard of the Fanzinothèque? A one-of-a-kind place whose mission is to keep Europe's largest collection of fanzines, those amateur micropublications created by enthusiasts of alternative arts and cultures. Since 1989, the Fanzinothèque has been fed by micro-publishers and artists' exhibitions, forming a space ideal for contemporary creation.

Third places, boosting cultural life in Greater Poitiers

"Les Usines" in Ligugé, "La Caserne" in Poitiers, "Le Clou" in Chauvigny: these three unusual spaces located in Greater Poitiers were born from the repurposing of industrial wasteland or old buildings such as a fire station. Transformed and co-constructed into real living spaces, these cross-functional projects fall within the sectors of sustainable development, new technologies, arts and culture. Here, you'll find local markets, co-working spaces, fablabs and associative cafes. There's innovation going on in Greater Poitiers!

The TAP, Poitiers Auditorium Theatre (National Stage)

Eclectic, surprising, multidisciplinary: take a look at the TAP programme! Labelled National Stage, this renowned architectural ensemble is recognised for its exceptional acoustics, the auditorium being a popular place for big names in classical music.

Sainte-Croix Museum

It's the first museum in Poitou-Charentes and the largest in Poitiers! Standing since 1974 on the site of the former Sainte-Croix abbey, the museum now houses rich archaeological collections from prehistory to the High Middle Ages and works from the 14th to the beginning of the 20th century (Bonnard, Vuillard, Sisley, Marquet...) A room is even dedicated to Camille Claudel's 3rd French public collection: 10 beautiful sculptures by the artist can be seen alongside a few by Rodin.

The Stained Glass Museum in Curzay-sur-Vonne

The idea that "stained glass is a thing of the past" is no more! The Curzay-sur-Vonne Stained Glass Museum is one of the few structures dedicated to stained glass in France. Operating since 1988 in a part of the Church of Saint-Martin, this museum helps enlighten the public on the history of this ancestral art so they can discover contemporary stained glass.

Le Confort Moderne: concert hall, national reference

Le Confort Moderne is an artistic brownfield site, concert hall and art centre in Poitiers. A place of creation supporting artists, where art is made, exchanged, experienced. It's in this unique place that the Fanzinothèque and the Jazzà Poitiers association come alive, showcasing this musical style in all its forms.

Le Miroir in Poitiers

Open to all fields of visual expression, Le Mirror, a singular cultural project, offers exhibitions that establish a dialogue between arts and forms, creative approaches and different eras. Since September 2022, the Le Miroir Exhibition Gallery has entered the walls of the old theatre on Place Leclerc in Poitiers. Decorating the entrance hall, the superb 100m² "verre églomisé" checkerboard representing the performing arts (1957) is the work of master glassmaker Robert Pansart, who also produced the decoration for the theatre of the liner France.

A land of legends, Greater Poitiers is dotted with myths and tales that shape the region!

Saint Radegund and the Grand'Goule

A frightening monster, a dragon with the body of a serpent, the wings of a bat, the talons of an eagle and the tail of a scorpion, **it was in the 6th century that the Grand'Goule terrorised the city**.

Haunting the underground, it devoured several nuns from Sainte-Croix abbey. **Saint Radegund, the patron saint of Poitiers, by dint of prayers, slayed it**.

Associated with the cult of the Saint, a wooden statue in the effigy of the monster was paraded during the procession on 13 August, the feast of Saint Radegund. Along the way, people threw little biscuits called "casse-museaux", shouting: "Grand'Coule, holy vermin, pray for us".

The procession was interrupted in the 19th century, but the wooden dragon, kept in the collections of the Sainte-Croix Museum, can still be seen there today.

The legend of Mélusine, and its link with Lusignan

Mélusine means **"wonder" or "sea mist"**, the Latin origin melus also suggesting "melodious, pleasant". In Lusignan, she's called "**Mère Lusigne**" because she's considered the mother of all the "Mélusins" (inhabitants of Lusignan).

The village of fairy Mélusine transports visitors between history and mythology as soon as they pass through the fortified gates, a remnant of its medieval past.

Mélusine, cursed by her mother, was condemned every Saturday to have her body transformed into a serpent's tail from the navel. She met Raymondin and offered him her hand on the sole condition that he gave up seeing her on Saturday. Raymondin consented to this marriage and became the most powerful lord of Poitou. Ten boys, all afflicted with a strange sign, were born from this union. But one Saturday, Raymondin was deceived and broke the ban, surprising his wife taking her bath as a half-snake. **Her secret revealed, Mélusine then transformed into a dragon**, and flew over the towers of Château de Lusignan before disappearing forever.

The mystery of the keys to Notre-Dame-la-Grande

The scene took place in 1202, when Poitiers was besieged by the English.

An employee of the town hall, or a clerk, depending on the version, sold out to the enemy, promising to deliver the keys to the city for a large sum of money. But when, on Easter night, he broke into the mayor's room, **the keys had disappeared**. They were found in the morning in the hand of the statue of the Blessed Virgin. That same night, the Virgin Mary, Saint-Hilaire and Saint Radegund appeared to the enemy soldiers, who killed each other. Today, **the north collateral window of the church recalls this miraculous episode and the divine intervention that liberated the town...**





MONUMENTS... IN POITIERS

Notre-Dame-La-Grande Church

You mustn't miss it! Anchored in the heart of Poitiers and an emblem of the city, Notre-Dame-La-Grande Church is one of its jewels. Its Romanesque Poitiers architecture is remarkable and the carved frieze on its facade, which traces certain episodes from the Bible - with the representation of Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden, the Annunciation, the birth of Christ etc - bears traces of polychromy.

The Palace of the Counts of Poitou, Dukes of Aquitaine

From the pedestrian street, **no one could imagine what's hidden behind this huge facade**. The Palace of Poitiers is indeed one of the most remarkable ensembles of medieval civil architecture in France. Different exercises of power followed one another in the Palace, which housed the Courthouse of the French Revolution until 2019. **Today, the monument allows the curious to learn about the city's past**, from Gallo-Roman times to the 19th century.

It now hosts concerts, shows and cultural events and is the subject of a vast rehabilitation programme planned until 2029 / 2030.

Saint-Pierre Cathedral

In the Angevin Gothic style, built on the initiative of Eleanor of Aquitaine and Henri II Plantagenêt from 1160 and characterised by its large dimensions, **Saint-Pierre Cathedral is a jewel of the city's landscape**.

Saint-Jean Baptistery

One of the oldest Christian monuments in Europe, the Saint-Jean baptistery dates back to the second half of the 4th century. Octagonal in shape, decorated with paintings with Gothic and Romanesque tendencies, it houses an old baptismal pool used for baptism by immersion until the 8th century, in addition to a collection of Merovingian sarcophagi.







The City and Land of Art and History label

On 7 December 2021, the Regional Heritage and Architecture Commission (CRPA) renewed the "City and Land of Art and History" label for a period of 10 years (2022-2032). The city of Poitiers obtained it in 1985 and it was extended in 2004 to the 40 towns of Greater Poitiers.

Chauvigny's Vélorail

The Vélorail is an **original way to discover nature around Chauvigny**. Railbikes take the old railway line which was once used to transport men and stone extracted from local quarries. Throughout its 8.7 kilometres, **the route offers visitors extraordinary viewpoints over the medieval town of Chauvigny**, as well as a green walk between dry valleys, undergrowth and wooded plains.

Lake Saint-Cyr and its bird sanctuary

Located 30 minutes from Poitiers, within the Saint-Cyr Estate and labelled Blue Flag since 2020, **the eponymous lake offers many activities during the summer season**. It has an aquazone with a floating inflatable structure and water slides, as well as an all-terrain electric scooter hire service, to wind your way through the 300 hectares of greenery without exerting yourself.

The League for the Protection of Birds (LPO) offers **discovery tours of the 40-hectare bird reserve**.

Lake Saint-Cyr, Beaumont-Saint-Cyr



300 hectares

That's the size of Domaine du Lac de Saint-Cyr, a protected green setting with many water- and land-based activities. Among them, the Haut-Poitou golf course adjoins Lake Saint-Cyr, amid lush nature. An 18-hole course ranked among the best in France!



9 hectares

That's the size of Blossac Park, a true green lung of Poitiers, located above the Clain Valley and the largest park in Poitiers. It's one of the most beautiful public spaces in France, and is made up of several gardens, including an English-style garden.

How about a trek, in slow mode? **Greater Poitiers has everything you need for soft mobility**: marked hiking trails, cycling routes, varied landscapes and flat terrain... In summer, canoe-kayak, paddleboard, pedalo and even, soon, swimming in the Clain are available! **Meet the surrounding nature...**

The best walks & hikes: Road to Santiago (Turonensis route)

The famous Santiago de Compostela Grande Randonnée route starts in Paris at the foot of the Saint-Jacques Tower and connects with the Spanish border just over 1,000 kilometres away. But did you know that this route, called Via **Turonensis, crosses Greater Poitiers from north to south**, passing through Dissay, Poitiers, Ligugé and Lusignan? A route that corresponds to a natural historic traffic corridor from Northern Europe and the Kingdom of France to the Pyrenees. In the Middle Ages, pilgrims heading to Compostela and passing through Poitiers could gather in several sanctuaries such as Ligugé Abbey.

Just a few kilometres from Poitiers, the Scandibérique® route, crossing France to Spain, offers **an opportunity to escape from everyday life and go green for a weekend**. On the programme: a bike break through the Vienne and its treasures! After Chauvigny, cyclists can enjoy small, peaceful country roads.With very low gradients, this route is today a favourite among cyclists.

Sometimes little known, Poitiers' gastronomy is full of gourmet treasures that make your taste buds tingle!

Cheeses: the Maras farm in Chauvigny

Greater Poitiers still has plenty of surprises left in store! At the Maras farm in Chauvigny, which has just celebrated its 40th anniversary, **the goats are massaged with an electric brush to the sound of classical music** ... to produce the best cheese that's sold on site or less than 30 km from the farm!

Broyés du Poitou: Maison Goulibeur in Poitiers and Maison Augereau in Saint-Benoît

Also called "assembly cake", **Broyé du Poitou is shared during friendly moments together**, breaking it by hand in the middle. That way, everyone can enjoy a piece, depending on how hungry they are!

Rannou Métivier Macaroons

One of the specialities of the region, this macaroon with its soft almond centre has been famous for more than two centuries. **Its secret recipe has been passed down from generation to generation**, from the Chartier sisters to today's Maison Rannou Métivier.

Cheese cake

Its black dome, deliberately burned, surprises at first sight. But this cheesecake, the flagship of Poitiers food culture, will delight the palate. With its light, creamy, slightly sweet centre, **it can be enjoyed as a dessert, aperitif or as a snack**.

Farci Poitevin

Farci Poitevin is made from a mixture of green vegetables (sorrel, aromatic herbs, Swiss chard, spinach, etc.), eggs, cream and sometimes bacon, cooked in cabbage leaves. This vegetable pâté can be eaten hot or cold, as a starter or main course. **A real treat**.

Chocolatier Fink

Recognised throughout Poitou since 1828, the elegant Maison Fink is an institution when it comes to chocolates, pralines, caramels, macaroons and ice cream. Enjoy to your heart's content.

Chabichou

An undisputed star of the region, the famous Poitou goat's cheese has the characteristic shape of a small truncated cone!


